Introductory Notes

The listings that follow record the official Royal Mail and privately produced stamp exhibition souvenir booklets that have been sold at, or in aid of, British stamp exhibitions down the years.

What are they? Private stamp booklets are primarily produced to raise awareness of the stamp show and to gain funds for the organisation by helping to pay for the event. Quantities of these privately produced booklets, where known, tend to be quite low, often no more than 250 copies. Royal Mail booklets, on the other hand, can run into the millions.

Criteria for inclusion This catalogue includes all British stamp exhibition booklets known to the authors, together with as much information about them as could be found. This includes guide prices, title of show, dates and location, printer, etc. The word "Stamp Exhibitions" in the title of this catalogue should be taken to include any philatelic event for which souvenir booklets were produced, including stamp fairs, the Philatelic Congress of Great Britain* and philatelic weekends, even though there may have been no formal exhibition of stamps as such.

A couple of Jersey, Isle of Man and Irish booklets from An Post, Dublin, are included because they commemorate London shows. Other Southern Ireland booklets produced for stamp shows, of which there are a huge number of private issues, are outside of the scope. Similarly, the many other types of private stamp booklets that are not stamp exhibition related are excluded. These include items such as books sold at hotels and philatelic creations for events such as the Coronation anniversary of 1978, etc.

Numbering system The system is almost the same as for the *British Stamp Exhibitions: Sheets, Cards, Labels & Presentation Packs* catalogue, but with SB added to differentiate.

Size of imagery Imagery size varies, as often the actual size of a booklet is unknown because the item has not been examined. However, the ratio between height and width has been maintained, even if its true size could be considerably larger or smaller.

Scanning Folded booklets open-out flat and do not get damaged when scanned, unlike stitched or stapled versions, so wherever possible the insides are also shown. The scale may be different where the item is especially wide when opened.

Press photographs To assist with the publicity machine, photos of the souvenir booklets have sometimes been produced by Royal Mail and private issuers for distribution to the philatelic and non-philatelic press. These are highly collectable and those actually seen have been mentioned in a footnote.

Pricing policy

There is no widespread market for stamp exhibition souvenirs and, consequently, little consensus as to what is the "right price" for a particular item. One dealer's 50p item could easily be priced by another at £5. Collectors who are familiar with this catalogue will know that the previous edition had been priced. In this second edition, the Authors have adopted an alternative approach; by providing the following guide to scarcity based on their experience:

- ★ Common. These booklets are offered for sale on a regular basis, and you may expect to find an example within a year or two.
 ★★ Less common. You may have to wait longer than a couple of years before you see another.
- ★★★★★★Rare. Buy it, as you probably won't see another in your lifetime.Unique [as in the case of original artwork].

Please remember, an item which is scarce is not necessarily valuable. Most booklets are very hard to find, often rating a $\star\star$ star.

^{*} PCGB sheets, cards, labels and presentation packs are excluded from the main catalogue due to the size, complexity of the subject and lack of access to suitable material by your authors. Also, there are other collectors who at the time of writing are working on cataloguing PCGB events. Exceptionally, PCGB stamp booklets are catalogued within these pages, as there are only a couple of items involved.



Booklets from Overseas Postal Administrations

The previous sections of this catalogue record details of souvenir stamp booklets issued by the postal administration of Great Britain, with a few from the British offshore islands of Jersey, Isle of Man, and Southern Ireland included where they are known to have been sold at a relevant show.

The subject can be further expanded by including stamp booklets issued by other postal administrations in commemoration of British stamp exhibitions as these were sometimes sold at the stand of the Post Office or its agent.

In truth, these are not entirely relevant here and so no attempt has been made to properly catalogue what has been found, or to actively pursue details of them. Several other booklets certainly will exist, so the few examples depicted below should be regarded as simply an indication of what this type of material can look like for those who may wish to pursue this extra avenue of collecting.

British Stamp Exhibitions

2: Souvenir Booklets

Stamp booklets have been a part of the British stamp exhibition souvenir scene since the 1930s although during the 1950s and 1960s there were no examples traced while researching this catalogue.

Souvenir booklets have often mimicked British Post Office issues by being either stitched, stapled or folded and have sometimes included interleaving and been made to the same physical dimensions. Royal Mail has added to our story by producing its own official stamp booklets that have helped to publicise Britain's major stamp shows from 1970 through to 2015.

This material is collected by an extremely enthusiastic band of collectors, whose main collecting interests are often either Post Office stamp booklets, stamp exhibition souvenirs, Cinderellas - or all three!

The initial edition of this catalogue was the first time that an in-depth cataloguing of souvenir booklets had been attempted and its readers have kindly added to the information and imagery included in this second edition.
