COUNTRY SORTING OFFICES

The Country Sorting Offices used an attractive and popular group of handstamps (L521-523). There are still a number of gaps in the lists of dates and there are also several Country Sorting Offices for which handstamps have not yet been reported. Reports of new handstamps and extensions to dates will be welcome.

Black is the normal colour for the majority of the handstamps used in the Country Sorting Offices. When a particular handstamp is also known in another colour, this is noted after the date using the following code: B=Blue, G=Green, R=Red.

FOREIGN BRANCH FREE STAMPS

Since volume 3 of the British County Catalogue was published, I have had the opportunity of studying over 30 of these uncommon handstamps. It has become apparent that the listing in the Catalogue is not quite accurate and that the handstamps can be divided into three basic types.

Type 1, L840, has month/day below FREE, and is known used between 1817 and 1822.

Type 2, L842-846, has day/month/day below FREE, and has upper corners rounded. The various handstamps that were used between 1824 and 1834 can be subdivided into two main groups:

Type 2a has concave upper corners with sharp points and is known between 1824 and 1829. The FREE line and the day/month/day line are lower than those of type 2b, the distance between the top frame and the bottom of FREE being about 6mm, while the distance between the top frame and the bottom of the day/month/day line being 11mm.

Type 2b has rounded upper corners and is known between 1830 and 1834. The distance between the top frame and the bottom of FREE is about 4mm while the distance between the top frame and the bottom of the day/month/day line is 9mm.

Type 3, L848, has square upper corners, and is known used between 1835 and 1839.

GENERAL POST RECEIVERS

Some years ago I published lists of General Post Receivers between 1742 and 1792¹ and between 1661 and 1742². The information described therein was incorporated into the lists included in volume 3 of the British County Catalogue. These lists would permit students to determine the Receiver for many of the common handstamps (L69), examples of which are present in many collections. I was disappointed, therefore, that until recently more information has not been forthcoming about the Receivers using specific handstamps.

It is impossible to be certain as to whether a particular Receiver used a specific handstamp, unless (s)he both signed the cover and used the handstamp. As far as I know, the only Receiver to do this (occasionally) was George Clemson who signed his name and used his handstamp (GC) on a few letters. Despite this uncertainty, if a Receiver has unique initials, and if the handstamp with these initials was used during the period that the Receiver was in post, it can be assumed that the particular Receiver used that handstamp. If the origin of a cover was from a place close to the site of the Receiver, this is additional confirmation of the probable Receiver using that stamp.

There are, however, several problems that are liable to occur. Some handstamps are made up of only one initial and, when this occurs, it is necessary to have seen several covers sent from the area of the Receiver, during the period that the Receiver was known to be in post. Other handstamps consist of initials that are shared by more than one Receiver in post in the year that the cover was used. In this instance particular care has to be taken before designating one particular Receiver as using that handstamp. In a number of instances (too many) the initials of the handstamp do not correspond to any known Receiver; one has to assume that there were some Receivers not in the Post Office Records, presumably because they did not receive a salary, and a few that may be in the Records but have not been spotted.

Interest in the General Post Receivers has been revived recently as the result of a study by Hugh Feldman³. It is hoped that this article will encourage others to report covers in their collections. The following information is required about each cover:

1. The date of the cover and the address from which it was sent (if known);
2. The initials in the handstamp and the size of the stamp in mm.
