NOTE: The Scheme which follows this Note is made under section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000 and amends the Successor Postal Services Company Inland Letter Post Scheme 2001. The Scheme, which comes into force on 28 October 2004, provides notification of a change to the compensation level for Special Delivery letters.

ROYAL MAIL GROUP PLC INLAND LETTER POST (AMENDMENT NO 13) SCHEME 2004

Made 22 October 2004

Coming into operation 28 October 2004

Royal Mail Group plc^(a) by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000^(b) and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on 28 October 2004 and may be cited as the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 13) Scheme 2004.
2. This Scheme shall be read as one with the Successor Postal Services Company Inland Letter Post Scheme 2001^(c) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 1) Scheme 2001^(d), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 2) Scheme 2001^(e), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 3) Scheme 2001^(f), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 4) Scheme 2002^(g), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 5) Scheme 2002^(h), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 6) Scheme 2003⁽ⁱ⁾, the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 7) Scheme 2003^(j), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 8) Scheme 2003^(k), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 9) Scheme 2004^(l), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 10) Scheme 2004^(m), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post Scheme (Amendment No 11) Scheme 2004⁽ⁿ⁾, and the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 12) Scheme 2004^(o).
3. A reference in this Scheme to the Successor Postal Services Company shall be read as a reference to Royal Mail Group plc.

Schedule 1, Paragraph 20

4. Paragraph 20 of Schedule 1 shall be deleted and the following substituted:

THE REPRESENTATIVE BODY OF THE CHURCH IN WALES

THE PLACES OF WORSHIP SITES ACT 1873

THE REVERTER OF SITES ACT 1987

THE FORMER ST MARK'S CHURCH, BRITHDIR, DOLGELLAU, GWYNEDD

WHEREAS

1. By a Deed of Grant dated 10 December 1897, and made between Louisa Janette Anne Tooth and Richard Edward Lloyd Richards a parcel of land situate and forming part of a farm known as Ty-Glas Farm in the parish of Dolgelly in the then county of Merioneth (now the county of Gwynedd), and now being the site of the former St Mark's Church, Brithdir was granted to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England under the authority of the Places of Worship Sites Act 1873.
2. The said former church ceased on 22 August 2003, to be used as a place of worship.
3. The said former church has ceased for a year to be used for the purpose of a worship and under the combined effect of section 1 of the Places of Worship Sites Act 1873, and section 1 of the Reverter of Sites Act 1987, the said land has reverted and become vested in The Representative Body of the Church in Wales on trust to sell the same.

NOW TAKE NOTICE

1. The Representative Body of the Church in Wales intends to make an application to the Charity Commissioners for the establishment of a scheme which extinguishes the rights of beneficiaries under the trust and which requires The Representative Body of the Church in Wales to hold the said property on trust for such charitable purposes as may be specified in the Order.
2. Every beneficiary who wishes to oppose the extinguishment of his or her rights should notify his or her claim in writing to The Representative Body of the Church in Wales of 39 Cathedral Road in the city of Cardiff CF11 9XF, not later than 22 January 2005.
