POST OFFICE SCHEME P1/1993

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this note has been made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and amends the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Scheme 1989. The Scheme, which comes into operation on 25th January 1993, revises certain postal charges and service details and prices for parcel redirection.

(This note is not part of the Scheme)

THE POST OFFICE INLAND PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 4) SCHEME 1993

Made	22nd January 1993
Coming into operation	25th January 1993

The Post office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 25th January 1993 and may be cited as the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1993.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Scheme 1989 (Post Office Scheme P1/1989) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1990 (Post Office Scheme P1/1990), the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Amendment

(No. 2) Scheme 1991 (Post Office Scheme P1/1991) and the Post Office Inland Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1992 (Post Office Scheme P1/1992).

Additional postage on certain parcels

2. Paragraph 6 of the Scheme shall be deleted.

Treatment of packets addressed to deceased persons

3. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 16 of the Scheme, the words "and paragraph 7 of this Scheme shall apply to parcels so redirected" shall be deleted.

Redirection by the public

4. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 20 of the Scheme, "British postal area, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man. A Datapost packet may only be redirected to an address within the British Postal Area." shall be deleted and "British Postal Area only." inserted in its place.

Rates of Postage

5. In Item 1(a) in column 2 of Schedule 1 to the Scheme as subsequently amended, "£2.65" shall read "£2.60".

Redirection by the Post Office

6. In Schedule 3 to the Scheme as subsequently amended, paragraph 4 shall be deleted and the following inserted in its place:

"Redirection by the Post Office. (For the purposes of this paragraph, all Private Boxes are classed as business addresses.) Redirection of parcels from their original address to the same addressee at another address in pursuance of the addressee's application:

A. On an application for parcel redirection from a private residence for any of the following periods:

	National £	Local £
(1) Not exceeding 1 month	11.50	7.50
(2) Not exceeding 3 months	23.00	11.00
(3) Not exceeding 6 months	32.00	14.00
(4) Not exceeding 12 months	49.00	19.00

(NOTE: (i) If both addresses involved in the redirection are within the area served from the same Parcelforce delivery office, the Local rate will apply, and if they are not, the National rate will apply.

(ii) Where parcels addressed to several members of one family bearing the same surname are all to be redirected to one other address, the addressees are to be regarded together as constituting one addressee for the purpose of the fee payable.)

B. On an application for redirection from a business address for any of the following periods:

(1) Not exceeding 6 months	24.00
(2) Not exceeding 12 months	32.00
(3) An additional fee shall then be payable at either a National or Local rate (see Note (i) in A above) for each parcel redirected. That fee shall be of such an amount as the Post Office may from time to time determine.
