**THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.  
HARLOW BUSH FAIR.**

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices acting in the Harlow Petty Sessional Division of the county of Essex, that a Fair has been annually held on the 9th and 10th days of September, at Harlow Bush Common, in the parish of Latton, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871":

And whereas, on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas Loftus Wigram Arkwright, Esq., as lord or owner of the said Fair and the tolls thereof, has consented in writing that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on the 9th and 10th days of September, at Harlow Bush Common, in the parish of Latton, in the said division of the said county, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.

**TREASURY WARRANT.**

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The Treasury Warrants, dated respectively the 10th day of September, 1878, and the 8th day of January, 1879, relating respectively to the rates of postage upon postal packets and letters conveyed by post to and from Peru are hereby repealed.

2. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rates fixed and specified in the said Warrant of the 10th day of September, 1878, in respect of postal

packets other than letters conveyed by post to and from Peru, shall be the rates of postage mentioned and specified in the Warrant of the 6th day of December, 1869, so far as such Warrant relates to such postal packets as aforesaid.

3. The rates of postage to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General in lieu of the rates fixed and specified in the said Warrants of the 10th day of September, 1878, and the 8th day of January, 1879, in respect of letters conveyed by post to and from Peru, shall be the rates of postage mentioned and specified in the Warrant of the 4th day of May, 1878, so far as such Warrant relates to such letters as aforesaid.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1879.

**TREASURY WARRANT.**

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The rates of postage and additional sums for registration, to be henceforth charged by or under the authority of the Postmaster-General, in lieu of the rates and sums now payable in respect of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post to and from the several countries and places by the routes and means of conveyance respectively mentioned and described in the Schedules Nos. 1, 2, and 3 hereunder written, shall be the rates of postage and additional sums which are fixed and specified by and in such Schedules respectively.

2. All such postal packets as are hereinbefore referred to shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the several regulations, conditions, prohibitions, and restrictions applicable thereto respectively, contained in the aforesaid Schedules, and in Schedule No. 4 hereunder written.

3. The Treasury Warrants dated respectively the 23rd day of December, 1875, the 30th day of May, 1876, the 28th day of November, 1876, the 22nd day of March, 1877, the 20th day of April, 1877, the 28th day of April, 1877, the 22nd day of June, 1877, the 4th day of August, 1877, the 26th day of February, 1878, and the 25th day of November, 1878, are hereby respectively repealed as from the date on which this Warrant comes into operation.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.
