Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1873," do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the Fair, which has been annually held in Loughborough, and that the Fair hitherto held in the district of Loughborough, in the county of Leicester, on the 13th day of November, in each year, shall in future be held instead on the second Thursday in November, in each year.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

The Treasury Warrant of the 24th day of January, 1881, relating to the conveyance by post of postal packets (which term in this Warrant means and includes all letters, post cards, newspapers, packets of commercial papers, packets of printed papers, and pattern or sample packets) between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Chili, and between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Hayti, and also between any British Colony or any Foreign Country on the one hand and the Republic of Chili on the other hand, and also between any British Colony or any Foreign Country on the one hand and the Republic of Hayti on the other hand, is hereby annulled to the extent to which such Warrant relates to the Republic of Hayti, but not further or otherwise.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage or benefice of the Holy Trinity, Bollington, in the county of Chester, and in the diocese of Chester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage or benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty-two pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year : And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage or benefice of the Holy Trinity, Bollington, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage or benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage or benefice of the Holy Trinity, Bollington : Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of fifty-two pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage or benefice, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
