SCHEME P8/1972

Notice is hereby given that the Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1971. The amending Scheme, which comes into operation on 1st October 1972 provides for the acceptance of Bangladesh into, and withdrawal of Pakistan from the Commonwealth, the renaming of Ceylon as Sri Lanka, the establishment of the United Arab Emirates and the application of the Inland Post Scheme to the Overseas Scheme.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST AMENDMENT (No. 3) SCHEME 1972

Made 29th September 1972

Coming into operation 1st October 1972

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st October 1972 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1972.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P7/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P2/1972) and the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P6/1972).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if the Post Office Act 1953 (as amended) were an Act conferring the power to make this Scheme.

Schedule of Commonwealth Countries

2. In Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the Scheme, under the heading "Specified countries or places" the list of countries shall be amended as follows:

(1) The country names "Ceylon" and "Pakistan" shall be deleted.

(2) The country names "Bangladesh" and "Sri Lanka" shall be inserted in the appropriate alphabetical positions

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Air Mail Postage Rates—Zone A

3. In Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Scheme, under the heading "Countries in Air Mail Postage Rate Zones" the list of countries shall be amended by inserting the country names "Ajman", "Fujairah", "Ras al Khaimah" and "Umm al Qaiwain" in the appropriate alphabetical positions.

Air Mail Postage Rates—Zone B

4. In part 2 of Schedule 5 to the Scheme, under the heading "Countries in Air Mail Postage Rate Zones" the list of countries shall be amended as follows:

(1) The country name "Ceylon" shall be deleted.

(2) The country names "Bangladesh" and "Sri Lanka" shall be inserted in the appropriate alphabetical positions.

Application of Inland Post Scheme

5. For the headnote and the whole of paragraph 45 of the Scheme, there shall be substituted the following:
"Application of Post Office Inland Post Scheme"

45. The paragraphs specified in Schedule 9 shall apply to postal packets transmitted by post under the provisions of this Scheme, to the extent and subject to the modifications specified in the said Schedule."

6. For the whole of Schedule 9 to the Scheme, there shall be substituted the following:

APPLICATION OF THE INLAND POST SCHEME

"The Post Office Inland Post Scheme 1972

(Post Office Scheme P7/1972)

Paragraph 14 (Postmarks).

Paragraph 18 (Treatment of packets addressed to deceased persons).

Paragraph 21 (Registration of newspapers).

Paragraph 27 (Postal facilities—general).

Paragraph 33 (Evasion of postage by re-direction).

Paragraph 34 (Poste Restante).

Paragraph 56 (Variation of route).

Schedule 2 (Postal facilities), items 3, and 8 to 20 inclusive.

Schedule 3 (Express delivery services), items 2, and 4 to 7 inclusive.

The reference in paragraph 18(1)(d) to the Post Office Scheme P7/1972 shall be read as a reference to the Scheme and the words in paragraph 18(2) "and paragraph 7 shall apply to parcels so redirected" shall be omitted.

This paragraph shall apply for the purpose only of the application of the other provisions of the Post Office Scheme P7/1972 mentioned in this Schedule to postal packets transmitted under the Scheme.

The reference in paragraph 34(h) to the provisions of the Post Office Scheme P7/1972 as to the return of postal packets shall be read as a reference to paragraph 20 of the Scheme.

The facilities referred to in items 8 to 20 inclusive shall extend to postal packets transmitted under the Scheme without further charge.

The limits of size and weight shall be those specified in the Scheme."

SCHEME P9/1972

Notice is hereby given that the Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on 1st October 1972 when surface parcel services to each country of the United Arab Emirates will be established. The Scheme amends the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 by making certain alterations to Schedule 1, which sets out the rates of postage on all parcels. Additionally the Scheme provides for the renaming of Ceylon as Sri Lanka, the provision of the parcel service to Bangladesh, the extension of the parcel service to all places in the British Indian Ocean Territory, the withdrawal of the surface parcel service to Madeira via Malta, and the application of the Inland Post Scheme to the Overseas Scheme.

Coming into operation 1st October 1972

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st day of October 1972 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1972.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P8/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P3/1972) and the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P5/1972).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if the Post Office Act 1953 (as amended) were an Act conferring the power to make this Scheme.
