Notice of application for licence to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority, Yorkshire Region by Dales Water Services Ltd., Witherick Lane, Melmerby, Ripon, North Yorkshire HG4 5JB on behalf of Mr Stephen Gilchrist, Lunshaw House, Boltby, North Yorkshire YO7 3HU, for a licence to abstract the following quantities of water from a borehole in the Estuarine Series at National Grid Reference SE 496 875, Lunshaw House in the Civil Parish of Boltby, Hambleton District, North Yorkshire: 500,000 gallons per annum, 2,000 gallons per day, 500 gallons per hour. The water is required for domestic and agricultural purposes throughout the year.

A copy of the application and of any map, plan or other document submitted with it may be inspected free of charge at Lunshaw House, Boltby, North Yorkshire YO7 3HU, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 9th July 1993 and ending on 6th August 1993.

POST OFFICE SCHEME L2/1993

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1982. The Scheme, which comes into operation on 12th July 1993. Introduces references to International Recorded and International Registered, the trading names for the registration and insured letter facilities and revises certain fees for ancillary services.

This note is not part of the Scheme.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST
AMENDMENT (NO. 14) SCHEME 1993.

Made 30th June 1993

Coming into operation 12th July 1993

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme.

Commencement and citation

1. —(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 12th July 1993 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 14) Scheme 1993.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1982 (Post Office Scheme P2/1982) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1982 (Post Office Scheme P6/1982), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1983 (Post Office Scheme P4/1983), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1984 (Post Office Scheme 3/1984), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1985 (Post Office Scheme 4/1985), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1986 (Post Office Scheme 2/1986), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1986 (Post Office Scheme 5/1986), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1987 (Post Office Scheme 2/1987) the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1988 (Post Office Scheme 3/1988), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1989 (Post Office Scheme L2/1989), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1990 (Post Office Scheme L1/1990) the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 11) Scheme 1991 (Post Office Scheme L1/1991), the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 12) Scheme 1991 (Post Office Scheme L2/1991 and the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 13) Scheme 1991 (Post Office Scheme L3/1991).

Interpretation

2. (1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the following words shall be added to the definition of "insured letter":

"and which facility is advertised under the trading name of "International Registered"

(2) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the following definition shall be inserted after "printed packet":

"Registered packet" means any packet (other than a printed packet or a small packet for transmission through a British Forces Post Office outside the British postal area) which is for the time being transmissible as a registered packet under the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Convention for the time being in force and the Detailed Regulations made thereunder and which facility is advertised under the trading name of "International Recorded".

Accelerated treatment and express delivery

3. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 29 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "£1.95" shall be deleted and "£2.70" inserted in its place.

Registration

4. In sub-paragraph (2)(c) of paragraph 32 of the Scheme as subsequently amended the amount "1.90" shall be deleted and "£2.50" inserted in its place.

Compensation for registered packets

5. In sub-paragraph (2)(a) of paragraph 33 of the Scheme as subsequently amended the amount "£950" shall be deleted and "£500" inserted in its place.

Insured letters

6. In sub-paragraph (1)(d) of paragraph 35 of the Scheme as subsequently amended the amount "£1500" shall be deleted and "£1000" inserted in its place.

Compensation for insured letters

7. In sub-paragraphs (2) and (3) of paragraph 36 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amounts "£1500" shall be deleted and "£1000" inserted in their place.

Advice of delivery, enquiries and claims for compensation

8. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 38 of the Scheme as subsequently amended the amount "35p" shall be deleted and "40p" inserted in its place.

Insured letters — compensation fees and maximum compensation

9. For schedule 6 to the Scheme, as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 13) Scheme 1991 there shall be substituted the following:
