NOTE: The Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1977. The amending Scheme, which comes into operation on 12th June 1978, provides for the operation of a "Local Reply Card" facility.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST
AMENDMENT (No. 1) SCHEME 1978

Made - - - - - 23rd May 1978
Coming into Operation - - - - - 12th June 1978

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 12th day of June 1978, and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1978.

2. For proviso (i) to sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 22 of Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme P5/1977) (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Printed packets

2. For proviso (1) to sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme there shall be substituted the following:

"(i) A card, envelope or wrapper for reply bearing either: (a) the printed name and address of the sender or his agent in the country or place in which the packet containing it was posted; or (b), in the case of certain prescribed countries, the name and address of the agent of the sender in the country or place to which the packet is addressed; and having either postage stamps of the country or place to which such packet is addressed properly affixed thereto by way of payment of the postage, or a suitable space for the proper fixing of such stamps, or, in the case of (b), being prepaid by any other means acceptable in the country or place to which the packet is addressed;"

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

SOUTH BEDFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

The South Bedfordshire District (Ashton Street, Dunstable)
(Traffic Regulation) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the South Bedfordshire District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Bedfordshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1), (2), (3), (6) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other enabling powers and with the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport given under section 84B of the Act of 1967 and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with section 84C (1) of the Act of 1967 proposed to make the following Order, the effect of which will be to:

(1) revoke the restrictions contained in paragraph 3 of Schedule 2, and paragraph 2 of schedule 3 and schedule 8 to the South Bedfordshire District (Various Roads) (Dunstable and Houghton Regis) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1978.

(2) prohibit any vehicle proceeding along the whole length of Ashton Street with the following exemptions in

licence to abstract the following quantities of water from the River Ouse at Overton Ings, SE 551558 in the Parish of Overton: 3,300,000 gallons April to September; 110,000 gallons per day; 11,000 gallons per hour. Further details of the application are: the water is to be used for spray irrigation of Grassland at Church Farm, Overton.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A COMBINED
LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW
OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF
IMPOUNDING WORKS AND TO ABSTRACT
WATER.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the South West Wales River Division by Peter Charles Batten, Astridge Farm, Tenby, Dyfed, for a combined licence to obstruct or impede the flow of unnamed stream, rising in field No. 4281 on O.S. SM 9237/9337 and flowing in a south-easterly direction to the proposed works and from there on in a south-easterly direction towards Goodwick in the Parish of Llanwnda, by means of impounding works, consisting of Reservoir formed by excavation and impounding with earth and clay bank at Tref-Wrgi Farm, Goodwick, Fishguard, Dyfed, and to abstract 300,000 gallons of water per season (1st April—30th September) from the said inland water at or near that point. The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 308,000 gallons.

NORTH WEST WATER AUTHORITY

DROUGHT ACT 1976

*Proposed Reduction of Compensation Water from Lake
Ennerdale into the River Ehen*

Notice is hereby given that the North West Water Authority have applied to the Secretary of State for an Order under section 1 of the Drought Act 1976 to authorise them to reduce temporarily for a maximum period ending on the 8th December 1978 the quantity of compensation water which they are required to discharge as follows:

At the present time the Authority are required to discharge 7 million gallons per day of compensation water in an even and continuous flow from Lake Ennerdale into the River Ehen.

This application is to reduce temporarily the compensation water from 7 million gallons per day to 4 million gallons per day.

Any objections to the proposed order must be made in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, S.W.1 within seven days of publication of this notice and it is requested that a copy of any such objection be sent at the same time to the undersigned.

A map showing the location of the point of discharge of the above compensation water may be inspected during normal office hours for a period of seven days from the publication of this notice at the Authority's office at The Hollins Hensingham Whitehaven.
