

The Inland Post Amendment (No. 9) Warrant 1953

Made	<i>25th March 1953</i>
Laid before Parliament	<i>27th March 1953</i>

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by Sections two, twelve, and eighty-two of the Post Office Act 1908(d) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant 1947(a) (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), applies to the interpretation of this Warrant as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
2. The rates of postage payable in respect of inland parcels transmitted by post and the limits of size and weight of such parcels shall be those specified in the First Schedule to this Warrant, and the entries in such Schedule shall have effect in substitution for the entries numbered 7 in the First Schedule to the principal Warrant as substituted by the First Schedule to the Inland Post Amendment (No. 7) Warrant 1952(c).
3. The rates of postage payable in respect of parcels posted in any part of the British Islands for transmission to the Republic of Ireland and the limits of size and weight of such parcels shall be those specified in the Second Schedule to this Warrant, and the entries in such Schedule shall have effect in substitution for the entries numbered 6 in Part I of the Sixth Schedule to the principal Warrant as substituted by the Second Schedule to the Inland Post Amendment (No. 7) Warrant 1952.
4. The Inland Post Amendment (No. 7) Warrant 1952 is hereby revoked.
5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and fifty-three, and may be cited as "The Inland Post Amendment (No. 9) Warrant 1953".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Warrant, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Warrant increases the rates of postage on inland parcels, and on parcels exceeding 2 lb. but not exceeding 8 lb. in weight posted in the British Islands for transmission to the Republic of Ireland.
