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## INTRODUCTION

After four years of use of the Maltese Cross cancellations, the Post Office saw a need for a specific mark to identify the receiving office and/or duty. The London Chief Office had been issued with a distinctive series of Maltese Cross marks numbered 1-12 in early 1843 but these, with the provincial marks in use, were not considered sufficient for the ever increasing mails. May 1844 saw significant changes with the introduction of a town numbering series and special London marks, the early Inland District cancellations being studied in this section. To distinguish them from the later series, which were mainly duplex types with vertical ovals, the earlier types are generally known to collectors as the "horizontal diamonds" because of the disposition of the oval of bars surrounding the diamonds. In all but a few cases they are single obliterators without dater dies, the only exceptions being the "Too Late" items which are numbered 38 and $76-78$. There are also multiple obliterators, numbers 45 - 49, for cancelling more than a single adhesive. As far as is known number 49 was used only on mail received from the Crimean War, where the rate being 3d. usually necessitated $3 \times 1 d$ adhesives.

A study of such a large group of marks, which were in use for over twenty years, has taken a long time to complete and there are many matters still open to discussion, amendment and probable revision. Over a period of more than fifteen years, many thousands of items have been studied and recorded but even the quantity seen does not necessarily give a true indication of the scarcity of the mark. In formulating our own rarity guide we have used the late M. Dubus's work "London Cancellations' as our basis. If two dates are shown as usage by him, our starting point was two dated examples, to which we added our own recordings. Similarly his dates, in most cases, were used and extended.

As our study progressed certain changes to M. Dubus's work evolved. Apart from new marks being tracked down [these amounted to more than fifty] series were added or repositioned. It seems evident, with the earlier series, sets were withdrawn when reissues were made but latterly they would appear to have been retained until their replacement was required. This is particularly apparent in the composite issues of $1856-1863$, shown by M. Dubus as series 23. No doubt the number of obliterators in use was
dictated by the number of operatives in the sorting office, hence a greater number within the range of $1-23$. We believe numbers 24 and 25 were issued to the Registration clerks and from 26 onwards the quantity recorded declines. Any gaps in the dates could mean they were never issued or we still have to record an example. In some cases overlapping of dates for the same numbers occurs. We cannot give an explanation for this, especially as M. Dubus stated the first two series were put into service successively and one replaced the other. The proof books show a series dated 27 th . September 1851 which we understand is an error and should read 1856. The series runs from 1-51 including the doubles 45-47 and the trebles 48 and 49. Most of the early numbers are included by M. Dubus as series 23 suffix "b", with earliest dates of usage in May 1857 , some months after the initial issue. Of the multiples only number 46 has been seen used.

The preceding series, recorded by $M$. Dubus as series 22 , includes two sets of marks numbered $1-10$, the former with thin bars, whilst the latter have thick bars. It is our opinion those with thin bars are series 23 , as the marks are similar to others recorded around the same dates.

Where possible proof copies have been shown and, on occasions, these differ from the drawings illustrated by M. Dubus. A typical example of this is series 17 which embraces the high numbers 52 - 75 . We traced three entries in the proof books dated June 1855, 27th. November, 1857 and late December 1860 (possibly the 31st) respectively. M. Dubus shows an entry dated 1st. February, 1860 but nearly all of his illustrations for the third issue correspond with the December 1860 proof book entries. We could not trace a proof book entry for 1st. February, 1860. Like M. Dubus we have found it difficult to identify a lot of the high numbers as very few exist on covers (or more likely wrappers). However, we have kept to the three proof book entries for our listing and given dates and rarity guides as applicable.

No record has been made of bar arrangements due to wear. The series issued in June 1852 were made with the bars cut very close to the diamonds with the consequence there are numerous instances when, with overinking, the bars join up to the diamond. The upper and lower bars disappear altogether in some cases. The proofs show them as closed bars in most instances and these have been used as our illustrations except for number 16, which was
llegible in the proof books and M. Dubus's illustration was used.

With regard to the series issued in July 1852 (Dubus series 7) there is mention they were in use until December 1855 and in three instances this is given as the latest date. This series of numbers ( $26-37$ ) was reissued and extended in December 1853 and, as we have only discovered items in use up to December 1853, we have ignored the later dates.

Following the main listing is a cross reference section to enable collectors who previously used M. Dubus's numbering system to relate them to the new numbers. In cases where $M$. Dubus showed a design but no dates were recorded and the item is not supported by a proof book entry, the mark has not been included in our listing. These are indicated by a dash after the Dubus number. Similarly, where it was considered an illustration was used more than once and there was no significant change (M. Dubus marked these items "probable") we have omitted it.

During our searches in the Post Office records various other series have been discovered but these have not been recorded in use and are not included in our lists. These are illustrated as an appendix at the end of this Handbook section.

## CATALOGUING

In view of the layout of this section being of ascendance of the numerals rather than of a chronological listing of series, the numbering comprises of a straight forward "number/letter" formation e.g. 13.C would be the third cancellation in date order of number 13. It is accepted once the initial basis has been set up, it will be difficult to insert the new types which are sure to appear once publication has been made. To overcome this, future amendments will show cancellations with a Roman numeral suffix e.g. 13. Ci, 13. Cii etc.

## ISSUE DATES

The proof books are not complete for the entire period but where possible entries noted have been used as the basis for the chronological listings. We have found, generally, the dates fall in line with those given by M. Dubus. The list shown in the records as 27 th . September $185 \underline{1}$ should have read 1856 , as already indicated.

## USAGE DATES

It will be appreciated the number of marks falling into this section is excessive and, although thousands of examples have been checked and recorded, the number of items per cancellation is in many instances relatively few. M. Dubus's dates of use are extended in many cases. In a few instances where it would appear and error or anomaly has occurred they have been ignored entirely.

Prices shown are, in the main, for complete, clear strikes but, in the case of the rarer items, an incomplete mark would command a high percentage of the valuation given. The prices for an average used adhesive, which generally was the 1d imperf ( 1844 to about 1854) or 1d star (about 1854 to 1862 ). Scarce or other value adhesives would increase the value of the cover/entire accordingly. In some cases this would exceed the value of the cancellation.
