THE POST OFFICE INLAND LETTER POST AMENDMENT (No. 7) SCHEME 1994

Made..... 20th April 1994
Coming into operation 6th May 1994

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

1 Commencement and Citation

- (1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 6th May 1994, and may be cited as the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1994.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Inland Letter Post Scheme 1989 (Post Office Scheme L1/1989) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"); as amended by the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1990 (Post Office Scheme L3/1990), the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 2 Scheme 1991) (Post Office Scheme L4/1991), the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1992 (Post Office Scheme L1/1992), the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1992 (Post Office Scheme L2/1992), the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1993 (Post Office Scheme L1/1993), and the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1993 (L5/1993).

SCHEDULE

POSTAL FACILITIES

The following amendments are made to Schedule 3 of the Scheme as subsequently amended:

- (1) In Item 13 after the words "from delivery" there shall be inserted the words "to a business address" and "£14.50" shall read "£15.00".
- (2) The following new definition shall be inserted after Item 18.

"19. Keepsafe..... Temporary retention of postal packets by withdrawal from delivery to a private address at the request of the addressee for a period not exceeding two months:

(1) for a period of up to 2 weeks.....	£5.00
(2) for a period of up to 3 weeks.....	£8.00
(3) for a period of up to 4 weeks.....	£10.00
(4) for a period of up to 2 months	£15.00"
