Royal Mail Group $plc^{(a)}$ by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000^(b) and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on 11 October 2004 and may be cited as the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 12) Scheme 2004

2. This Scheme shall be read as one with the Successor Postal Services Company Inland Letter Post Scheme 2001^(c) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 1) Scheme 2001^(e), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 2) Scheme 2001^(e), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 2) Scheme 2001^(e), the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 2) Scheme 2001⁽⁶⁾, the Consignia ple Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 4) Scheme 2001⁽⁶⁾, the Consignia ple Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 4) Scheme 2002^(g), the Royal Mail Group ple Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 5) Scheme 2002^(h), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 6) Scheme 2003(i), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 7) Scheme 2003⁽ⁱ⁾, the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 8) Scheme 2003^(k), the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 9) Scheme 2004^(l) and the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 10) Scheme 2004.^(m), and the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No 11) Scheme 2004.⁽ⁿ⁾

3. A reference in this Scheme to the Successor Postal Services Company shall be read as a reference to Royal Mail Group plc.

Paragraph 8 Undeliverable and Re-posted Letters

4. Paragraph 8.4.2 shall be deleted and the following substituted:

"8.4.2 the letter was originally posted as a Franked Letter or with a Printed Postage Impression and the sender's name and address are (a) not on the cover or envelope, or (b) they are illegible, or (c) the sender's name and address are on the cover or envelope but the address is outside the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, then the letter may be dealt with or disposed of at the discretion of Royal Mail Group plc;

5. Paragraph 8.4.3 shall be deleted and the following substituted:

"8.4.3 the letter was not originally posted as a Franked Letter or with a Printed Postage Impression and the sender's name and address are (a) not on the cover or envelope, or (b) they are illegible, then the letter may be opened. If the name and address of the sender are inside, the address is in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or Isle of Man, and the letter does not consist solely of advertising material, newspapers or magazines, then the letter may be returned to the sender. Otherwise the letter may be disposed of at the discretion of Royal Mail Group plc."

The Hexagon Welfare Trust was settled in the Cayman Islands in 1996 to benefit qualifying former BCCI employees world-wide and the Triangle Loans Trust was settled in Guernsey, Channel Islands at the same time to benefit qualifying former employees who had qualifying BCCI staff loans or mortgage subsidies on 3rd party loans.
