

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 1) WARRANT 1925

DATED SEPTEMBER 30, 1925.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare, as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1923, (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
2. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation, paragraph (2) of Regulation 16 (Special conditions as to postcards) of the Principal Warrant shall be read and take effect as though "five and seven-eighth inches in length or four and one-eighth inches in width" were substituted for "five and a half inches in length or three and a half inches in width".
3. Where the sender of a parcel addressed to the Irish Free State desires that the parcel may be delivered to the addressee free of all Customs duties and other charges thereon, the following rules shall apply to the parcel:—
 - (a) There shall be charged and paid on the parcel, in addition to all postage payable thereon, the amount of the Customs duty, and of all other charges payable on the delivery of the parcel, and such further fee, not exceeding one shilling, as the Postmaster General shall direct;
 - (b) The sender shall sign an undertaking (in such form as the Postmaster General may from time to time prescribe), to -pay on demand the amount of such Customs duties and other charges as aforesaid;
 - (c) The sender shall also, if so required, pay, by way of deposit, at the time of posting the parcel, such sum as the Postmaster General may prescribe in respect of such Customs duties and other charges.
- 4.—(1) There shall be charged and paid in respect of late fee postal packets such fees not exceeding one shilling and sixpence as the Postmaster General may prescribe.
(2) In this Regulation the expression "late fee postal packets" means postal packets posted after the ordinary hours of collection for particular despatches by being handed in at such Post Offices or otherwise posted in such manner as the Postmaster General shall prescribe.
5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1925.
6. This Warrant may be cited as "The Inland Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1925."
