THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 8) WARRANT 1935

DATED APRIL 30, 1935.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Post Office Acts 1908 to 1935, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare, as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant 1923 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
- **2.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, Regulation 5 (Parcels) of the Principal Warrant is hereby repealed and the following Regulation shall have effect in substitution therefor:—
 - "5. There shall be charged and paid on parcels the following rates of postage (that is to say):—

On every parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, sixpence.

On every parcel exceeding three pounds but not exceeding four pounds, seven pence.

On every parcel exceeding four pounds but not exceeding five pounds, eight pence.

On every parcel exceeding five pounds but not exceeding six pounds, nine pence.

On every parcel exceeding six pounds but not exceeding seven pounds, ten pence.

On every parcel exceeding seven pounds but not exceeding eight pounds, eleven pence.

On every parcel exceeding eight pounds but not exceeding fifteen pounds, one shilling."

- (2) In paragraph (3) of Regulation 10 (Dimensions and weight) of the Principal Warrant "fifteen" shall be substituted for "eleven".
- (3) The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to parcels transmitted to the Irish Free State.
- 3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of July 1935.
- **4.** This Warrant may be cited as "the Inland Post Amendment (No. 8) Warrant 1935".
