

## **THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (NO. 3) WARRANT 1942**

DATED JANUARY 15, 1942.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1940, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant 1936 (hereinafter called “the principal Warrant”) and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2.—(1) In addition to the prohibitions contained in Regulation 2 of the principal Warrant there shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any postal packet containing any of the goods specified in Group I of the First Schedule to the Export of Goods (Control) (No. 39) Order, 1941, if the packet is addressed to a person on board any of His Majesty's ships.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply to:

- (i) tobacco or any goods which do not consist or form ingredients of articles for human consumption: or
  - (ii) goods sent in a sample packet.
- (2) The sender of a postal packet, being a parcel, to any such person as is mentioned in paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall complete and affix to the parcel a declaration in the prescribed form specifying the name and address of the sender and the contents of the parcel.
3. This Warrant may be cited as “The Inland Post Amendment (No. 3) Warrant, 1942”.
  4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 16th day of January, 1942.
