

## **The Inland Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant 1951**

Made	<i>11th June 1951</i>
Laid before Parliament	<i>12th June 1951</i>
Coming into force	<i>1st July 1951</i>

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by sections 2 and 82 of the Post Office Act 1908(a) and section 7 of the Post Office (Amendment) Act 1935(b) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant 1947(c) (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
2. Regulation 47 of the principal Warrant (which provides that there shall be charged and paid on each Cash on Delivery packet, in addition to the postage and other charges payable on such packet, a fee according to the scale of fees set out in the Fifth Schedule to the principal Warrant) shall be read and have effect as if for the scale of fees set out in the said Fifth Schedule there were substituted the scale set out in the Schedule to this Warrant.
3. In the proviso to regulation 55 of the principal Warrant (which enables the Postmaster General to pay the amount of a void trade charge money order subject, if a period of twelve months or over has elapsed since the last day of the month in which the order was issued, to the prescribed renewal fee), for the words "twelve months" there shall be substituted the words "six months".
4. The Interpretation Act 1889(d) applies to the interpretation of this Warrant as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
5. This Warrant may be cited as "The Inland Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant 1951".
6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of July 1951.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Warrant, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Warrant increases the fees payable on a cash on delivery packet by 4d. at each step of the scale with a minimum of 10d. for a Trade Charge not exceeding £1. The amendment made to regulation 55 of the principal Warrant reduces from twelve months after the last day of the month of issue to six months after that day the period within which a void trade charge money order can be renewed without fee. The Warrant comes into operation on the 1st of July 1951.
