

## The Inland Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant 1956

Made	<i>26th June 1956</i>
Laid before Parliament	<i>27th June 1956</i>
Coming into force	<i>1st July 1956</i>

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred upon us by sections 8, 15 and 81 of the Post Office Act, 1953(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

### *Interpretation*

- 1.—(1) This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant 1955(b) (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant") and the Inland Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant 1956(c).  
(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(d) applies to the interpretation of this Warrant as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

### *Compensation for unregistered parcels*

2. In paragraph (F) of regulation forty-seven of the principal Warrant (by which paragraph, in relation to parcels transmitted between the British postal area and the Republic of Ireland, the sum of two pounds was substituted for the maximum compensation specified in regulation thirty-five of the principal Warrant which may be paid in respect of unregistered parcels), for the words "two pounds" there shall be substituted the words "four pounds".

### *Citation and Commencement*

3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Inland Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant 1956", and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1956.
