THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 1) WARRANT, 1899. DATED JANUARY 25, 1899.

1899. No. 12.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1899."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrant.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898.*

Rates of postage to Guatemala.

3. From and after the date on which this Warrant comes into operation, parcels may be transmitted by the post between the British Islands and Guatemala subject to the payment of the same rates of postage and to the same regulations as are respectively payable upon and applicable to parcels transmitted by the post between the British Islands and Salvador.

Commencement of Warrant.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the First day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.
