

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 3) WARRANT, 1899. DATED MARCH 21, 1899.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

- Short title.** 1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 3) Warrant, 1899."
- Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.** 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all warrants amending the same.
- Rates on parcels to Finland via Sweden.** 3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on outgoing parcels transmitted to Finland *via* Sweden, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the rates of postage following, that is to say :—
- On a parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight two shillings and threepence.
- On a parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight two shillings and ninepence.
- On a parcel exceeding seven pounds in weight and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight three shillings and threepence.
- Regulations as to such parcels.** 4. All such parcels shall be subject to the same regulations as are applicable under the Principal Warrant to parcels transmitted by the post between the British Islands and Sweden.
- Commencement of Warrant.** 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.
- Date.** Dated this twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.
