THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 5) WARRANT, 1899. DATED JUNE 19, 1899.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf,

do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant, 1899."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898\* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.

Rates on parcels to Mauritius viâ Colombo.

- 3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on outgoing parcels transmitted to Mauritius viâ Colombo, there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the rates of postage following, that is to say:—
  - On a parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, one shilling.
  - On a parcel exceeding three pounds, and not exceeding seven pounds, in weight, two shillings.
  - On a parcel exceeding seven pounds in weight, and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, three shillings.

Commencement. 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1899.
