THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 6) WARRANT, 1899. DATED JULY 10, 1899.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 6) Warrant, 1899."

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter referred to as be read with the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. Warrants.

3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Rates on Warrant on outgoing parcels transmitted to Greece, there shall parcels to Greece. be charged and paid on such parcels the rates of postage following, that is to say :-

On a parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, two shillings and three pence.

On a parcel exceeding three pounds, and not exceeding seven pounds, in weight, two shillings and nine pence.

On a parcel exceeding seven pounds in weight, and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, three shillings and three pence.

4. All such parcels shall be subject to the same regulations as Regulations are applicable under the Principal Warrant to parcels transmitted parcels. by the post between the British Islands and Algeria.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of Commencement of August, 1899.
