

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 2) WARRANT, 1903. DATED MARCH 12, 1903.

1903. No. 213.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1903." Short title.
2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1902§ (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and any Warrant amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.
3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to any place specified in the First Schedule hereto, there shall be charged and paid, in lieu of any rates now payable on such parcels, the rates of postage mentioned against the names of such places respectively, in such Schedule. Rates on parcels to places specified in First Schedule.

Rates of postage on parcels to places in Second Schedule. Maximum weight and dimensions.

4. On every outgoing parcel addressed to any place specified in the Second Schedule hereto, there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage mentioned against the names of such places respectively, in the said Schedule.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster General there shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post, under this Warrant, to any place mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, any parcel, the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight or dimensions respectively specified against the name of such place in the said Schedule.

Commencement of Warrant.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1903.
