Warrant to be read with existing Warrants, 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1902* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and any Warrant amending the same.

Rates on parcels to Rhodesia. 3. In lieu of the rates of postage now payable under the Principal Warrant on outgoing parcels addressed to Rhodesia there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage specified in the Schedule hereto.

Limit of weight of parcels. 4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General there shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight of which shall exceed the limit of weight specified in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement of Warrant. 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 24th day of July, 1903.
