**THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 2) WARRANT, 1907. DATED FEBRUARY 14, 1907.**

1907. No. 92.

We the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1907."

Short title.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,† and all Warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

3. In lieu of the rates of postage now payable on out-going parcels addressed to Rhodesia* and the Bechuanaland Protectorate, and transmitted via Cape Colony, there shall be charged

Rates to Rhodesia and the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

and paid on such parcels the rates of postage following, that is to say:—
