THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 5) WARRANT, 1907. DATED APRIL 25, 1907.

1907. No. 320.

We the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant, 1907."

- 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,* and all Warrants amending the same.
- Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.
- 3. Parcels may be transmitted by post from the Agencies of the Postmaster-General established in the places specified in the First Column to the places specified opposite thereto in the Second Column of the Schedule hereto, subject to the rates of postage mentioned in the said Schedule.

Transmission of parcels from certain Agencies to Egypt and beyond,

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General there shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Maximum weight and dimensions.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof.
