THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 6) WARRANT, 1907. DATED MAY 15, 1907.

1907. No. 367.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 6) Warrant, 1907."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,* and all Warrants amending the same.

Rates on parcels to British Solomon Islands Protectorate.

3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to the British Solomon Islands Protectorate and transmitted *via* New South Wales, there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage following, that is to say:—

If not exceeding one pound in weight ...	1	3
If exceeding one pound in weight, for the first pound	1	3
and for each additional pound, or fraction of a pound, up to eleven pounds in weight	0	9

Maximum dimensions.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed three feet and a half in length, breadth, or depth, or six feet in length and girth combined.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof.
