THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 11) WARRANT, 1907. DATED SEPTEMBER 16, 1907.

1907. No. 730.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 11) Warrant, 1907."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

Repeal.

3. The entry in Part I. of the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant relating to parcels addressed to Tahiti is hereby repealed.

Rates on parcels to Pitcairn Island and French Settlements of Oceania. 4. On every outgoing parcel addressed to Pitcairn Island and on every outgoing parcel addressed to the French Settlements of Oceania, namely, the Society Islands, Gambier Archipelago, Marquesas Islands, Touamotou, Leeward Islands, and Tubuai, and transmitted viâ France, there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage specified against the names of such places respectively in the Schedule hereto.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General there Maximum shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post under weight and this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight or dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of Commence-October, 1907.
