(No. 27) WARRANT, 1908. DATED DECEMBER 14, 1908.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

| 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906* (hereinafter called "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.  | Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. |

On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation parcels may be transmitted by post from the Agencies of the Postmaster-General established at the places specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto to the places specified opposite thereto respectively in the second column of the said Schedule, subject to the rates of postage mentioned therein against the names of such places respectively as though such places had been included in Part III. of the 2nd Schedule to the principal Warrant. | Extension of principal Warrant.            |
| 4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.  | Maximum weight and dimensions              |
| 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 15th day of December, 1908.   | Commencement of Warrant.                   |
