THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 37) WARRANT, 1910. DATED OCTOBER 27, 1910.

> No. 1144. 1910.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,\* and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows : --

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title.

Parcel Post Amendment (No. 37) Warrant, 1910."

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,† and all Warrants amending the same.

3.—(1) In lieu of the rates of postage specified in Part III. of Rates on the Second Schedule of the Principal Warrant with respect to parcels posted at the Agency of the Postmaster-General in Beyrout and addressed to the United Kingdom, the rates of postage specified in Part I. of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted.

(2) In lieu of the rates of postage specified in Part IV. of the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant, with respect to parcels posted at the Agency of the Postmaster-General in Beyrout, the rates of postage specified in Part II. of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted.

4. On every out-going parcel addressed to Tonga there shall be Rates on charged and paid the rates of postage specified in Part III. of the Schedule hereto.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 4th day of November, 1910.
