We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908, (a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title. Parcel Post Amendment (No. 62) Warrant, 1914."
- 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906(b) (hereinafter called "the be read with Principal Warrant''), and all Warrants amending the same.

3. The Warrants specified in the First Schedule hereto are Repeals. hereby repealed respectively to the extent mentioned in the said First Schedule.

4. On all outgoing parcels addressed to any place specified in Amended the Second Schedule hereto and transmitted under this Warrant, Rates on there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage mentioned against the name of such place in the same Schedule.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General there shall not be forwarded, conveyed, or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight or dimensions specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of Commence-April, 1914.
