of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 72) Warrant, 1915."

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1906,(a) and all Warrants amending the same.

Rates on parcels to Fanning Island viâ Canada. Maximum weight and

dimensions.

- 3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to Fanning Island and transmitted viâ Canada there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage specified in the Schedule hereto.
- 4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this Warrant any parcel the weight or dimensions of which shall exceed the weight and dimensions specified in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement of Warrant. 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1915.
