

THE IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 1) WARRANT 1927

DATED AUGUST 20, 1927.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. Regulation 8 of the Principal Regulation is hereby repealed, and the following Regulation shall have effect in substitution therefor:—
 8. In respect of every incoming parcel to which such Regulations as are referred to in Section 14 of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882 apply, and upon the contents of which any duty is payable under the Customs Acts, there shall be charged and paid such further sum or fee as the Postmaster-General shall direct not exceeding the following (that is to say):—

Where the Duty does not exceed ten shillings—sixpence;
Where the Duty exceeds ten shillings—one shilling.
- 2.—(1) The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1925, (in this Warrant referred to as “the Principal Warrant”) may be cited as “The Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post Warrant, 1925.”
 - (2) This Warrant may be cited as “The Imperial and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Principal Warrant.
3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1927.
