WARRANT, 1909. DATED AUGUST 2, 1909.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907§ (hereinafter called “ the Principal Warrant ”) and all Warrants amending the same.

- Extension of Principal Warrant.** 2. The Principal Warrant shall apply to letters posted in the United Kingdom for transmission to the British Indian Post Offices at Bahrein, Guadar, and Muscat as if those offices were countries or places specified in the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant.
- Short title.** 3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant, 1909."
- Commencement.** 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 3rd day of August, One thousand nine hundred and nine.
- Date.** Dated this 2nd day of August, One thousand nine hundred and nine.
