THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 13) WARRANT, 1915. DATED JUNE 30, 1915.

1915. No. 926.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Act, 1908,(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants. 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907,(b) and all Warrants amending the same.

Rates of postage on certain literature for the blind. 2. There shall be charged and paid on every outgoing printed packet consisting of books and papers impressed with characters in relief for the use of the blind and addressed to any part of His Majesty's Dominions or to a British Protectorate or to the United States of America the following rates of postage (that is to say):—

On every packet not exceeding 18 ozs. in weight, for every 2 ozs. or fractional part of 2 ozs. ... $0\frac{1}{2}d$. On every packet exceeding 18 ozs. and not exceeding 6 lb. 5d.

Maximum weight and dimensions.

3. No packet shall be transmitted under this Warrant which exceeds 6 lb. in weight or two feet in length, or one foot in breadth or depth, or if the packet be made up in the form of a roll 30 inches in length or 4 inches in diameter.

Short title.

4. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 13) Warrant, 1915."

Commencement of Warrant 5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915.
