THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 16) WARRANT, 1919. DATED NOVEMBER 9, 1919.

## 1919. No. 2228.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1918,(& and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:-

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to Colonial Post Warrant, 1907,(b) and all Warrants amending the same.

be read with existing warrants.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, an outgoing postal packet may, at the request of the sender, be conveyed through any part of its course in the post by an air mail service packets by established by the Postmaster General between the United Kingdom and any country or place outside the United Kingdom, in accordance with such rules as the Postmaster General may from time to time prescribe.

Transmission of postal

- (2) In this Warrant a postal packet so conveyed or intended to be conveyed as aforesaid is referred to as an "Air express packet."
- 3.—(1) An Air express packet must be marked with the Posting of words "Air Mail Express" or with such other words as air express may indicate the desire of the sender that the packet shall be packets. conveyed by an Air Mail Service.

- (2) An Air express packet must be posted by being handed in at such Post Offices as the Postmaster General shall designate for the purpose.
- 4. Upon every Air express packet there shall be charged and Fees on air paid the following rates of postage and fees (that is to say):—

express packets.

(a) The ordinary rates of postage sums and fees payable upon such postal packet in respect of its conveyance by post otherwise than by an air mail service.

(b) As regards conveyance by an air mail service a fee not exceeding 2s. 6d. for each ounce or fractional part of an ounce in weight.

5. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 16) Warrant, 1919."
