THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST (INSURED BOXES) AMENDMENT (No. 2) WARRANT, 1921. (1) DATED JUNE 11, 1921.

1921. No. 1064.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920, (3) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

Application of Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907, and Warrants amending the same.

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post (Insured Boxes) Warrant, 1909(h) (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. (1)
- 2. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation the provisions of the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907,(1) and all Warrants amending the same, (18) so far as the same

are applicable, shall, subject to the provisions hereof, apply to the transmission of insured boxes addressed to any country or place with which the Postmaster-General may for the time being have an arrangement for the exchange of insured boxes, as if such boxes were insured letters transmitted under the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907, and all Warrants amending the same.

8.—(1) There shall be charged and paid on every insured box addressed to any country or place with which the Postmaster-General may for the time being have an arrangement for the exchange of insured boxes, the following rates of postage:—

sixpence.

On every insured box not exceeding six ounces in weight,

On every insured box exceeding six ounces in weight, for the first six ounces, sixpence, and for every additional two ounces or fractional part of two ounces, twopence.

(2) Every insured box shall be registered and insured under and in accordance with the provisions of the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1907, and all Warrants amending the same.

4. In respect of every incoming insured box to which the Warrant dated the 8th day of June, 1885, (a) and made by the Commissioners of the Treasury on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Customs and of the Postmaster-General, apply, and upon the contents of which any duty is payable under the Customs Acts, there shall be charged and paid the further rate or fee of sixpence.

5. Regulations 2 and 3 of the Principal Warrant and the first Repeal. and second Schedules to the Principal Warrant are hereby repealed.

6. This Warrant may be cited as the "Foreign and Colonial Post (Insured Boxes) Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1921."
