THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 2) WARRANT 1922

DATED OCTOBER 17, 1922.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts 1908 to 1920, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners order direct and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1921 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.
- **2.**—(1) On and from the date when this \Warrant comes into operation, magazines for Canada and Newfoundland may be enclosed by the senders for transmission in Mail bags to be provided by the Postmaster-General for the purpose.
 - (2) Each such Mail bag shall be of such weight, and shall in respect of the make up and mode of posting of such Mail bag and the payment of postage thereon and in all other respects conform with such rules as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe.
- **3.**—(1) Where magazines all of which are to be delivered to the same addressee are transmitted under this Warrant, the weight and dimensions of the magazines shall be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe Provided that the Mail bag containing such magazines does not exceed the weight prescribed under this Warrant.
 - (2) Except as aforesaid the weight and dimensions of magazines transmitted under this Warrant shall not exceed those specified in the Principal Warrant.
- **4.** There shall be charged and paid on every Mail bag transmitted under this Warrant the rate of postage of one penny for every pound in weight of the Mail bag and its contents, provided that for this purpose the weight of each Mail bag and its contents shall be calculated to the nearest pound.
- **5.** This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1922."
- **6.** This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1922
