THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST AMENDMENT (No. 5) WARRANT 1924

DATED MARCH 31, 1924.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts 1908 to 1920, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order direct and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1921, and all Warrants amending the same.
- **2.** In this Warrant:—
 - (1) The expression "The motor overland service" means any motor transport service established between Haifa or elsewhere in Palestine or Syria and Baghdad by which mails may from time to time be conveyed.
 - (2) The expression "Great Britain" includes Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.
- **3.** Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, postal packets transmitted by post between Great Britain and Iraq and countries beyond may be conveyed through part of their course in the post by means of the motor overland service.
- 4. There shall be charged and paid on every postal packet posted in Great Britain and conveyed by the motor overland service the ordinary rates of postage and fees payable upon such postal packet in respect of its conveyance by post, and an additional fee not exceeding threepence for each ounce or fractional part of an ounce in weight.
- 5. A postal packet intended to be conveyed under this Warrant must be marked with the words "By overland mail Haifa-Baghdad," or with such other words as may indicate the desire of the sender that the packet shall be conveyed by the motor overland service.
- **6.** This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant, 1924."
- 7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1924.
