

THE IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN POST AMENDMENT (No. 3) WARRANT 1938

DATED FEBRUARY 24, 1938.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts 1908 to 1935, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Imperial and Foreign Post Warrant 1934 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2.—(1) The rates of postage specified in Regulation 1 and in Regulation 3 (as substituted by the Imperial and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant 1935) of the Principal Warrant shall cease to apply to outgoing letters, postcards and reply postcards posted in Great Britain for transmission to any of the countries or places specified in the Schedule hereto (being countries or places to which, in addition to the countries and places specified in the Schedule to the Imperial and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant 1937, such outgoing letters, postcards and reply postcards will, as the normal means of transmission and without any request of the senders, be conveyed by Air Mail Service under the Empire Air Mail Scheme) and in lieu thereof the rates of postage hereinafter specified shall apply to such outgoing letters, postcards and reply postcards.
 - (2) On every letter, postcard or reply postcard posted in Great Britain for transmission to any country or place specified in the Schedule hereto there shall be charged and paid the same rates of postage as by virtue of the said Imperial and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant 1937 are charged and paid in respect of letters, postcards and reply postcards posted in Great Britain for transmission to any country or place specified in the Schedule to that Warrant, that is to say:—
 - (i) On every such letter, three halfpence if the letter does not exceed one half ounce in weight and an additional three halfpence for every additional half ounce or fractional part thereof;
 - (ii) On every such postcard (not being a reply postcard) one penny;
 - (iii) On every such reply postcard, twopence.
3. The Schedule to this Warrant shall be deemed part of this Warrant.
4. This Warrant may be cited as "The Imperial and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 3) Warrant 1938".
5. This Warrant shall come into operation forthwith.
