

The British Postal Agencies Revocation Regulations 1967

I, The Right Honourable Edward Watson Short, M.P., Her Majesty's Postmaster General, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by sections 5, 8, 11, 15, 20, 24 and 81 of the Post Office Act 1953 (as amended or substituted by section 28 of and the Schedule to the Post Office Act 1961), and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if these regulations and the warrants and regulations hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.
2. The warrants and regulations mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
3. These regulations may be cited as the British Postal Agencies Revocation Regulations 1967, and shall come into operation on 1st January 1968.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations revoke the warrants and regulations relating

- (i) to postal services between the British Postal Agencies in the Persian Gulf and other places, and between one Agency and another, and
- (ii) to money orders applied for, issued or payable at the Agencies. The last Agency, Abu Dhabi, was closed on 31st December 1966.
