All second class mail, namely, printed papers, commercial papers, samples, etc., and the parcel post for these countries will continue to be sent by the land and sea routes.

POSTAGE RATES FOR FIRST CLASS MAIL

LETTERS. The rate for letters and letter packets for these countries is $l\frac{1}{2}d$. for each half ounce (instead of the former rate of $l\frac{1}{2}d$. for the first ounce and Id. for each subsequent ounce). By the use of lightweight stationery most letters can be reduced in weight to less than half an ounce.

POSTCARDS. Postage on postcards remains unchanged at Id.

POSTAGE RATES FOR SECOND CLASS MAIL

The rates for second class mail (printed papers, commercial papers, samples, etc.) and parcels, which continue to go by land and sea, remain unchanged. These services provide facilities for sending a wide range of documents and articles at low postage rates. Details are contained in the Post Office Guide and in a booklet entitled "Second class mail for abroad at low postage rates," obtainable through any Post Office.

SAVING OF TIME

Carriage by air saves time.

Egypt and Palestine ... 2-3 days
India and Ceylon
South Africa ... About a week

East Africa About a fortnight
Australia New Zealand ... A fortnight or more

FREQUENT SERVICES

There are frequent despatches by air, as shown below:—

Egypt, Palestine and India ... 5 a week
East Africa, Malaya, Australia and
New Zealand ... 3 a week
South Africa ... 2 a week

The attainment of approximately equal loads for the different flights is of great importance, and you will help the Post Office by posting your correspondence as soon as it is ready—the earlier in the week the better.

POSTING

There is no long r any special fee to pay for air transmission to the countries mentioned. All your letters, letter packets and postcards for these countries go by air as a matter of course at the rate of $l\frac{1}{2}d$. for each half ounce for letters and ld. for postcards; air mail labels or any other marking to indicate air transmission should not be used.
