

line (now redundant but the embankment remaining); thence following the loop line to a point where it crosses Lovely Lane; thence along the centre of Lovely Lane and continuing along the centre of Thewlis Street as far as the Warrington to Widnes railway line; thence along that line in an easterly direction to Bank Quay Station; thence following the main London to Carlisle railway line in a northerly direction to a point where it is crossed by the embankment of the former "avoidance" line; thence in a westerly direction along the said embankment to the point of commencement.

The Warrington (No. 16) (Bewsey) Smoke Control Order, 1969

An area of 230 acres or thereabouts bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the westerly Borough boundary and the Dallam Brook; thence along the line of the brook in a north-easterly direction to the main London to Carlisle railway, which it then follows to the former Cheshire Lines "avoidance" line (now redundant but the embankment remaining); thence along the line of the embankment in a westerly direction to the Borough boundary; thence along the Borough boundary in a northerly direction to the point of commencement.

POST OFFICE

SCHEME P1/1970

NOTE. The Scheme which follows this note amends the Inland Post Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 1253) (as amended) which, by virtue of paragraph 3 (1) of Schedule 9 to the Post Office Act 1969, have effect as if they were provisions of a scheme made under section 28 of that Act.

The amending Scheme (which comes into effect on 1st June 1970):

- (a) increases from 10s. to £2 the limit of value of items of certain descriptions contained in a postal packet at or above which the packet is compulsorily registrable by virtue of regulation 36 (2) of the Regulations, and amends the definition of "value" in that regulation;
- (b) amends the conditions to be complied with in relation to registered postal packets containing coin, so as to enable "collectors' coin" (that is, coin having a greater value than its face value) of any value to be sent by registered post in a single postal packet, subject to the limits of size and weight and other conditions otherwise applicable;
- (c) increases from £4 to £5 the maximum amount of compensation which the Post Office may pay in respect of unregistered parcels sent between the British postal area and the Channel Islands or the Republic of Ireland.

This note is not part of the Scheme.

THE POST OFFICE (INLAND POST) AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1970

Made - - - - - 28th April 1970
Coming into Operation 1st June 1970

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of, and paragraph 3 (1) of Schedule 9 to, the Post Office Act 1969, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1. (1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st day of June 1970 and may be cited as the Post Office (Inland Post) Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1970.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Inland Post Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 1253) (hereinafter called "the Regulations"), as amended by the Post Office (Inland Post) Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1969.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if the Post Office Act 1953 were an Act conferring the power to make this Scheme.

B

Compulsory registration

2. For paragraph (2) of regulation 36 of the Regulations there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(2) Where an unregistered postal packet is found when in the post to contain:

- (a) any uncrossed postal order in which the name of the payee has not been inserted; or
- (b) any cheque or dividend warrant which is uncrossed and payable to bearer; or
- (c) any bearer security (including a share warrant, scrip or subscription certificate, bond or relative coupon); or
- (d) any bank note or currency note, being current in the British postal area or elsewhere; or
- (e) any unobliterated postage or revenue stamp available for current use in the British postal area or elsewhere (except a revenue stamp embossed or impressed on an instrument which has been executed); or
- (f) any National Savings stamp; or
- (g) any coupon, voucher, token, card, stamp or similar document, exchangeable (singly or with any other such documents) for money, goods or services; or
- (h) coin or jewellery;

of a total value of £2 or over, the packet shall be registered (whether or not it is eligible for registration under regulation 33 (1)), and may be detained for that purpose at any post office through which it passes. In this paragraph the expression "value", except in relation to jewellery or in relation to coin of greater value than its face value, means face value."

Conditions as to registered packets

3. For paragraph (4) of condition 3 in Part II of Schedule 4 to the Regulations there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(4) If the packet contains coin:

- (a) the coin shall be packed in such a way that it cannot move about; and
- (b) coin of a total value in excess of £5 shall not be enclosed in any one postal packet, except in a case where the value of each coin exceeds its face value."

Compensation for unregistered parcels sent to or from the Republic of Ireland

4. (1) The maximum sum which the Post Office may pay under regulation 38 of the Regulations (as applied by regulation 55 thereof) in respect of an unregistered parcel transmitted between the British postal area and the Republic of Ireland shall be £5.

(2) Paragraph (7) of regulation 55 of the Regulations is hereby revoked.

Compensation for unregistered parcels sent to or from the Channel Islands

5. (1) The maximum sum which the Post Office may pay under regulation 38 of the Regulations (as applied by regulation 55A thereof) in respect of an unregistered parcel transmitted between the British postal area and the Channel Islands shall be £5.

(2) Paragraph (7) of regulation 55A of the Regulations is hereby revoked.

LLEYN RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Rural District Council of Lleyn acting in their capacity as coast protection authority hereby give notice in accordance with the provisions of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Coast Protection Act 1949, that they propose to make an Order applying the provisions of section 18 of the said Act (which prohibit save under licence the excavation or removal of materials (other than minerals more than fifty feet below the surface) on under or forming part of any portion of the seashore to which
