POST OFFICE
SCHEME P10/1973

NOTE:—The Scheme which follows this note has been made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Inland Post Scheme 1972. The Scheme, which will come into operation on 10th September 1973, provides for new postal charges for inland letters, registered newspapers and parcels.

(This note is not part of the Scheme.)

THE POST OFFICE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1973

Made - - - 21st August 1973

Coming into operation - 10th September 1973

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 10th September 1973 and may be cited as the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1973.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Inland Post Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P7/1972) (hereinafter called “the Scheme”) as amended by the Post Office Inland Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P1/1973).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Scheme were an Act of Parliament.

Rates of postage and limits of size and weight

2.—(1) For item 1 in Schedule 1 to the Scheme there shall be substituted the following item:

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

DUNKINFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

The Dunkinfield Town Hall (No. 18) Smoke Control Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Dunkinfield Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 28th August 1973, made an Order entitled the Dunkinfield Town Hall (No. 18) Smoke Control Order 1973, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include

anthracite, coke, and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st May 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order (and of the map referred to therein), may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Dunkinfield, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from 7th September 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Department of the Environment, Queen Anne Chambers, Tothill Street, London, SW1H 9JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area commencing at a point at the junction of Astley Street and King Street, then proceeding along the centre of Astley Street in an easterly direction to its junction with Zetland Street, thence along the centre of Zetland Street in a southerly direction to its junction with Chapel Street, thence along the centre of Chapel Street in a westerly direction to its junction with King Street, thence along the centre of King Street in a northerly direction to the point of commencement at its junction with Astley Street.
