

THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 6) WARRANT, 1906.
DATED SEPTEMBER 8, 1906.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

Warrant to be read as one with existing Warrants.

2. Subject to the provisions of the Principal Warrant, where any express packet conveyed by special messenger throughout its whole course exceeds one pound in weight, there shall be charged and paid, in addition to all other fees chargeable under the Principal Warrant, a fee (hereinafter referred to as an "extra weight fee") of threepence.

Extra weight fee on express packets.

3. The following words shall be added at the end of Article 52 of the Principal Warrant, namely:—"but no extra weight fee shall be charged in respect of such packet."

Amendment of Article 52 of Principal Warrant.

4. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment (No. 6) Warrant, 1906."

Short title.
