THE INLAND POST AMENDMENT (No. 19) WARRANT, 1919.
DATED MAY 22, 1919.

1919. No. 632.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1918,^(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

Amendment of Reg. 51 of Principal Warrant.

Short title.

Commencement.

Date.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1903^(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

2. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Regulation 51 of the Principal Warrant (which relates to express mileage fees) shall be read and take effect as though "sixpence" were substituted for "threepence" wherever that expression occurs.

3. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment (No. 19) Warrant, 1919."

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1919.

(b) EXISTING WARRANTS.—The Principal Warrant, S.R. & O., 1903, No. 107, is printed S.R. & O. Rev., 1904, Vol. 10, "Post Office," p. 8, and all the amending Warrants are printed, both as separate S.R. & O., and in the Vols. of S.R. & O., for their respective years of issue: a part detailed list of them is given in the "Index to S. Powers and R. & O. in Force, Dec. 31, 1919," under the heading "POST OFFICE 1 (A) (i)." Whilst this Vol. was in the press a further Amtd. Warrant (No. 20) S.R. & O., 1920, No. 805, increased the rates on letters and parcels as from June 1, 1920; rates on other postal packets were increased by S.R. & O., 1918 (No. 584) III, p. 653, which revoked S.R. & O., 1915, No. 1042 which made the first increases in inland postal rates since the outbreak of war.
