

THE IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN POST AMENDMENT (No. 1) WARRANT 1938

DATED SEPTEMBER 2, 1938.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1935, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Imperial and Foreign Post Warrant, 1938 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2.—(1) The Principal Warrant shall apply to outgoing letters and postcards posted in Great Britain for transmission to Hong Kong as if that country or place were specified in the First Schedule to the Principal Warrant.
(2) The Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant shall be read and have effect as if "Hong Kong" were omitted therefrom.
3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Imperial and Foreign Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1938".
4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 2nd day of September, 1938.
