

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 1) WARRANT, 1897. DATED OCTOBER 29, 1897.

1897. No. 850.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to Us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of Us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1897."
2. In lieu of the rate of postage of eightpence for each additional pound, or fraction of a pound, after the first pound in weight, chargeable under the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1897,* on a parcel addressed to British East Africa and on a parcel addressed to Zanzibar respectively, there shall be charged and paid the sum of sixpence.
3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the First day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
