## THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST (AMENDMENT No. 3) WARRANT, 1897. DATED NOVEMBER 30, 1897.

## 1897. No. 917.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :---

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post (Amendment No. 3) Warrant, 1897."

2. This Warrant, and the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post (Amendment No. 1) Warrant 1897,\* shall respectively be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1897.†

3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1897,<sup>†</sup> on parcels addressed to Ceylon, China, and Hong Kong, respectively, the following rates shall be charged, namely :--

If not exceeding one pound in weight, ninepence;

If exceeding one pound in weight, for the first pound, ninepence, and for each additional pound or fraction of a pound sixpence.

4. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the said Warrant on a parcel addressed to Cape Verde Islands the following rates shall be charged, namely :--

- If not exceeding three pounds in weight, two shillings and fivepence;
- If exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, two shillings and tenpence ;
- If exceeding seven pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, three shillings and threepence.

5. A parcel addressed to Cape Verde Islands shall not exceed in length two feet, or in length and girth combined four fect.

6. A parcel addressed to Ceylon shall not exceed in length three feet six inches, or in length and girth combined six fect.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of January 1898.
