

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT
(No. 10) WARRANT, 1899. DATED DECEMBER 5, 1899.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 10) Warrant, 1899." Short title.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1898* (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same. Warrant to be read with existing Warrants.

3. In lieu of the rates of postage payable under the Principal Warrant on outgoing parcels transmitted to Jamaica there shall be charged and paid on such parcels the rates of postage following, that is to say :— Rates on parcels to Jamaica.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 13th day of December, 1899. Commencement of Warrant.
